"The Mystery of the Omnis"

God is Omni...

In today's lesson, your children have been learning three very big words: Omnipresence, Omniscience, and Omnipotence. While teaching these three words may seem like a lofty goal for young children, we believe that the meanings of these words provide a greater understanding into the very character of the God we serve. With a greater understanding of who God is, we believe our children will have a greater desire to love and follow God. Below are explanations of each of these words.

God is Omnipresent

Key Verse: Psalm 46:1

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble."

Omnipresent means ever-present, always there. There is no place that we can run from God. Psalm 139 vividly captures how foolish it is to believe that we can ever be out of the presence of God. There is nothing we can hide from Him. Moreover, since He is always with us, we are never alone. He is our constant source of true friendship and true protection. We never need to be afraid because God is always with us. For a child, this can provide great comfort. Mommy and Daddy can't always be there to shelter and protect a child, but God can. As adults, this comforts us because we know we can trust the care of our children to God at all times, even when we can not be with them. Below are several verses that you and your children can study to learn how faithful a companion our God is to us.

God is Omniscient

Key Verses: Hebrews 4:13 and 1 John 3:20b

•Hebrews 4:13

"And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account."

•1 John 3:20b

"God is greater than our heart, and he knows everything."

Omniscience means all-knowing. There is nothing that God does not know. Our thoughts, our actions, our attitudes; all are known by God. Often we convince ourselves that we can fool God just like we can fool others. What futile thinking! We may be able to deceive others, but we can never deceive God. Ananias and Sapphira tried to deceive God in Acts chapter 5, but no one was fooled, and they paid for their attempted deceit with their lives. Why is it important, then, for all of us to understand the characteristic of God's omniscience? If God is all-knowing and understands everything, that means he understands even when we don't. He knows our past, present, and future! He knows what is going to happen ten minutes from now, ten hours, ten days, ten years, ten centuries from now. Why then, do we often

try to take control of our lives thinking we know better than God? He knows our future, He knows what is best for us, so why do we strive in vain to be smarter than God?

Why should we worry, then, about what is going to happen to us? Why should we fret when we can't comprehend the circumstances in our lives? Psalm 37 speaks of this very thing. We are not to fret, or worry, for God already knows the outcome. God knows, understands, and is planning for us a future and a hope for those who have put their trust in Him (Jeremiah 29:11). We can trust Him completely! What an awesome comfort to know that even when we don't understand what's going on, God does.

Psalm 73 speaks of one man's desire to understand, and how he almost turned his back on God because of his lack of understanding. But when he turned to the Lord for his answers, his faith in God was restored. We can fully trust in God if we will only turn to Him for our answers, rather than looking for answers from the world, which will only let us down. Below are several verses that speak of God's wisdom and incomprehensible knowledge.

God is Omnipotent

Key Verses: Job 42:2 and Matthew 19:26

•Job 42:2

"I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted."

•Matthew 19:26

But Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Omnipotence means all-powerful, almighty. There is no power greater than God. God has the power to accomplish whatever He wills. Who else can claim that? Genesis 1 and 2 illustrate His awesome power of just His word. He spoke, and things were created. God is in charge of the seasons and nature. "Mother Nature" has absolutely no control, all of the seasons are in God's capable hands. Satan and his dominion are no match for God. Although they try to overthrow God, in the end they will be forever conquered in one swift blow from the Almighty. There is nothing too great for God to overcome.

As children and adults, we can find comfort in God's power. There is no problem too big that God can't handle it. There is no power on earth that can thwart the plans of God, including man. No government, no earthly ruler can overcome God. We can trust Him with anything and everything. What an awesome God we serve! He deserves all the glory, honor, and praise that we can give Him!
